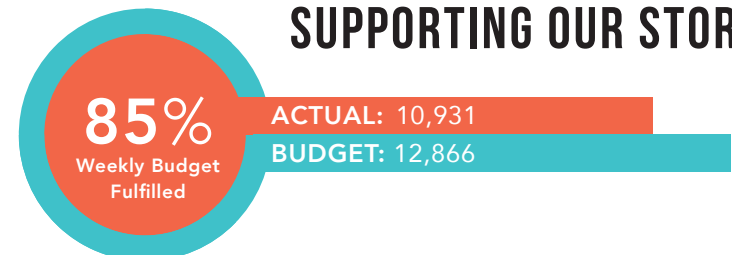
4. YARN FOR PERRYVILLE PRISON
